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From Under the Presidents Helmet

Since my last newsletter in March, I have gotten my machine all ready for another great year of AT riding. I have managed to get it quite muddy, washed multiple times, dusty inside and out, and made a few more changes to it. I am sure you are enjoying doing the same thing. I find you can never make too many changes to your "ride". The aftermarket folks are always coming up with something that I need.

MI-TRALE does the same for you, our members. We always try to develop a new trail or modify a current one that you find that you must ride. Sometimes we share a point of interest that you may have passed up. For this year the opening of the "LL" route that will connect Land O' Lakes Wisconsin to the Bond Falls Recreational area is a unique route for MI-TRALE. The section that is a result of our important partnership with the Ottawa National Forest is one that you must ride. It is heavily wooded and winds thru the Ottawa, with very few straight sections. The views force you to take it slow and enjoy every bit of it. We are already looking at a few optional rides off the current route to call you back for more. You need to mark your calendar for the August 22, 2015 Grand Opening of this new route. Check <u>www.mi-trale.org</u> for updates on this event. This is a great opportunity for the Michigan and Wisconsin ORV riders to join together in a day of fun.

Note: August 22-23, 2015 is a free ORV riding weekend in Michigan. No license is required for in or out of state riders!

MI-TRALE believes it is important to open up connectors from our border state of Wisconsin, so not only will you have an opportunity to use the new "LL" route, but also the just recently signed Phelps – Iron River "PI" route that connects Phelps, Wisconsin to the "IM" route just west of Iron River. The Michigan side of the connector is signed from Duck Lake Road in Michigan across US2 to American Vets Road which connects to the "IM" route. We will be working with the Wisconsin clubs to work on this trail. The next step is to get approval from the Ottawa National Forest to use several forest roads near the border to connect to the Nicole National Forest which will remove the pavement in the current temporary connector.

Another great route we are working on is the new connector from Ontonagon to Rockland "OR" route. The next step is for the state to approve the route as a Multi-use Designated Route. We hope to have the approval in July. Then the fun begins with engineering evaluations and specifications and then bids to prepare the route for safe use. The route will provide access to Ontonagon from the east and south sides of town.

MI-TRALE is moving into the world of geocaching. The Courtney Equestrian Trails were placed in May, 2015. The Pioneer Route will be completed by the end of June. If this is something that our riding guests enjoy we will make plans to place addition caches on the trails. Share your thoughts. We are using <u>www.geocaching.com</u> to list the details of our sites.

Remember to ride as much as possible, as safe as possible, and above all have fun!

OBJECTIVES for 2015:

Beyond the joy of riding together, we have an objective; to become familiar with and help the DNR to promote the EQ trails in our area. We have a goal to work with the DNR, and suggest we help to map and sign them and get them on the DNR web site. Some of the DNR trails to ride: Bill Nicholls Route, Ottawa East Connector Route, Sidnaw-Bergland Route and Iron River-Marenisco Route. We also plan to ride prospective future trails south of Bruce Crossing. Again, this is a part of your fun and a part of helping to promote EQ opportunities in the Western U.P.

COURTNEY EQ TRAILS:

A reminder, we maintain these trails via our maintenance agreement with the Ottawa National Forest, supporting each other in trail improvements and projects. If you would like to join the team, you can visit MI-TRALE.org for a membership application. If you would like to help for just "the day" at any of our work bees, you can simply sign a FREE day membership form offered on site by MI-TRALE.

Trails are groomed and maps are posted. There is still logging activity on trails south/east of the lake, which limits riding in that area. YEAH....a river crossing is not just being talked about, but IN THE PLANS. MI-TRALE has significant grant funds to repair the ground and post more signage in the future. Suggested; shared trail etiquette, invasive species, and highway signage.

GEOCACHING WITH MI-TRALE:

MI-TRALE is now an official Geocaching member; Visit GEOCACHING.COM. We have stashed Geocaches on the Courtney EQ Trails and there are plans to do the same on the ORV "Pioneer Trail". We had fun putting them in place. We hope you have fun searching for them!!!

MICHIGAN DEPT OF NATURAL RESOURCES (MDNR) PROPOSED CAMP SITE - NEAR THE COURTNEY EQ TRAILS:

MI-TRALE with a lot of public support, proposed this camp ground some time ago. The DNR has been reviewing it. The proposal is to have equestrian sites available yet to have a camp ground which will be open to the general public. MI-TRALE plans to "partner-up" with the DNR and offer help throughout the proposed project.

There are other great roads to ride in the area, north of Highway M-38, on DNR managed property.

We welcome any comments, concerns about the trail conditions and of course, your help. Our meetings are open to the public on the first Monday of each month.

Did you know.....

- The horse has one stomach. In contrast, cattle, sheep, goats, bison, deer, elk, caribou, moose, and camels are "ruminants" which means (among other things) they have four digestive chambers instead of just one stomach.
- The horse is an herbivore, which means it feeds mostly on plants.
- The normal horse's small intestine is about 70 feet long.
- The normal horse's large intestine is about 12 feet long.
- The average horse's heart weighs approximately 9 or 10 pounds. The great New Zealand / Australian racehorse, Phar Lap, had a heart that weighed 14 pounds. The great American racehorse Secretariat had a heart estimated during his autopsy to weigh 21 pounds, though the heart was not weighed.
- Horses produce approximately 10 gallons of saliva a day.

MICHIGAN TRAIL FACTS

The Michigan ORV trail/route system covers 3,700 miles with 73% on state forests. Of the system, 30% is cycle trail, 50% is ATV trail and 20% is route.

In the Lower Peninsula, the system is the only legal place to ride Non-Secretary of State licensed ORVs on public lands other than frozen waters.

In the Upper Peninsula, it is legal for ORVs to operate on state forest roads as well as the designated trail system, unless a specific state forest road is posted closed to ORV use. Trails are lightly groomed and riders are likely to encounter narrow sand trails, rough moguls, steep hills, stumps, rocks, brush, loose surfaces and other hazards.

MI-TRALE has been providing the ORV safety training for several years. The training is required before an ORV safety certificate can be issued. It is important that all ORV users are familiar with how to safely operate an ORV, and the rules that must be followed in the state of Michigan. When an ORV is used safely and within the law, we have a better chance of keeping our trails open.

MI-TRALE & DNR 4th Annual SPORT Ride

On June 13th over 100 ATV riders participated in the 4th annual State Park Off Road Trek (SPORT) ride. This year the ride started at the Twin Lakes State Park, or the Baraga State Park with a social hour at Twin Lakes State Park from 9:00 to 10:00 with beverages, donuts, and cookies provided. After a brief welcome and safety talk the riders headed out for the Ontonagon Township Park. Brief stops were taken at the triple trestles over the Firesteel, and the Adventure Mine in Greenland. Khris Kennedy stated "Was a great day for a ride, we had a wide variety of trail conditions and weather. There were even a few flat tires and breakdowns to challenge us. The Parks at either end of the ride offered a very special treat with a small inland lake at one end to the largest freshwater lake in the world at the other."

After a leisurely 3 hour ride the riders arrived at the Ontonagon Township Park on the shore of Lake Superior where food was made available by the Ontonagon County Animal Protection (OCAP) group. At the park there were tables set up by the Ontonagon County Historical Society, Friends of the Porkies, Ottawa National Forest, MI-TRALE, and the Ontonagon County Chamber of Commerce, each sharing what they do for the community.

After a good meal the riders headed on their own afternoon adventures, with a few getting back to Twin Lakes after 7:00.

It was a great day of riding even with some rain in the afternoon that kept the dust down, but did not dampen spirits.
