We enjoyed the social time from 5:00 to about 6:15, which provided time for everyone to get to know our guests (Partners). During this time a slide show was being run that provided an overview of the many MI-TRALE events, and activities that took place during the year.

After the dinner was completed, the evening's program began, with Howard Lindberg providing an interesting overview of Plum Creek and providing some prizes after correct answers were given to his questions.

This was followed by a presentation given by Brian Glodowski on history Keweenaw Land. Who would have guessed that Keweenaw Land was started by a land grant made in payment for work done on the Portage Canal in about 1865!

The final presentation was Don Helsel, MI-TRALE President, providing a brief slide show of the work that MI-TRALE has done in 2014. It has been a great year for MI-TRALE. All new low maintenance signage installed on our 520 miles of trail, an outstanding, first of its kind, multi-use trails guide published, and a long list of events and projects completed.

Mr. Helsel then presented the 2014 awards:

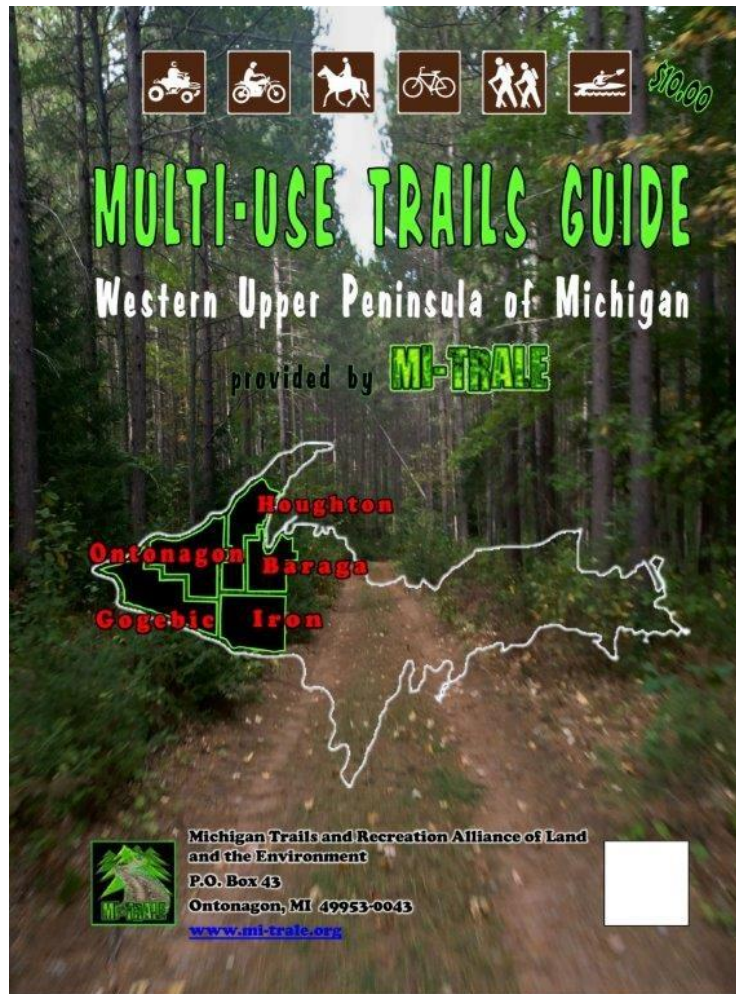
