You will see a lot of information about your new 2014 MI-TRALE map in the following pages. For those of you that buy the map, we want to thank you very much for your support. I recall the days when I was the just a map buyer...those were the good old days! Now I, with others, am involved with the development and delivery of the map to you, the buyer. I never realized the effort that goes on behind the scenes to get a piece of paper out into the market. It is extraordinarily multi-faceted! Here's an overview of who the Map Committee is working with: The GIS folks (the people who make the map), Advertising sponsors (the ones that make the map happen), Layout folks (those who create the overall design of the map and decide what goes where), and the Printer (who makes the final product that goes into your hands). You have to proof everything each step of the way: The ads, the location of sponsors on the map, the location of special services, trail route locations and even the legends. Then you get to do it all over again once all the pieces are together. Whew!

The coordination of all these groups is a major, time-consuming task. We have complicated the process this year by trying something new: A book style map rather than the normal, folded flat map. This change allows us to have over 80 pages of very detailed maps for you. The real bonus is that we can include the Ottawa National Forest's (ONF) roads on these maps, as well. This is possible because of the unique partnership MI-TRALE has with the ONF, and that affords us an expansion of map space so that we can provide vou with this increased level of detail.

We look forward to your comments on this new map style as it sure is a major change from our previous maps. Why do we do this? We are always working to improve our maps to further your trail-riding pleasure! We also want to ensure that you have a great tool with which to plan your trips well so you have a safe and informed vacation. After all, we all know the trails already!

It is a bit early in the season, but we want to mention this Fall's Michigan Trails Week. You will be hearing more about it as the year progresses. This takes place the 4th week of September. MI-TRALE is working with all trailrelated organizations across the UP to provide special events during this week. So hold some vacation time open from September 20 – 27 this year. This will include motorized and non-motorized recreation, so there will be a trail ride event for all!

So, with MI-TRALEs great, new, super-informative map and the Michigan Trails Week to look forward to... Are you now planning your 2014 vacation? Important Information from MDNR

Changes to ORV license prices will improve trails, riding experience

Michigan's fishing, hunting and off-road vehicle (ORV) license options will change beginning March 1, 2014. The new license structure – authorized by the Legislature and signed into law by Gov. Rick Snyder in 2013 – provides vital funding to improve outdoor recreation opportunities for hunters, anglers and ORV riders.

What does this mean for ORV riders? The new ORV license structure includes two levels depending on the type of riding you are doing. There will be a \$26.25 ORV License that will be required on eligible county roads, state forest roads in the Upper Peninsula and eligible national forest roads as well as on the frozen surface of public waters. This license is required to operate anywhere off of private lands.

In addition to the ORV License, an ORV Trail Permit (an additional \$10, for a total of \$36.25) will be required when operating on <u>State-designated ORV trails, routes and scramble areas</u>.

Revenue generated from license sales will provide a better experience for ORV riders, with improvements that include:

- Acquiring an additional 300 miles for the state's designated ORV trail system.
- Providing sufficient trail grant funding for stakeholders to develop, groom and brush trails and add signage.
- Providing local law enforcement grants and grants for trail expansion areas.
- Ensuring a safer environment for ORV trail users by increasing the number of conservation officers in Michigan, thereby boosting opportunities for education contacts and public safety through trail patrols.
- Replacing and renovating failing or aging infrastructure, including bridges and culverts to address safety and environmental issues.
- Creating destination places by adding trail connections to communities through easements and acquisitions.
- Improving the ORV license-buying experience both online and in retail stores by enhancing the retail sales system.
- Creating a southern Michigan ORV area closer to local population centers.
- Better promoting Michigan's extensive network of trails to strengthen our reputation as the nation's Trails State.

Off-roading is a big part of our state's outdoor recreation landscape, and we intend to roar to the top as the destination state for ORV enthusiasts – benefiting thousands of small businesses around the state and providing quality opportunities for residents and visitors to connect with our natural resources. If you've purchased an ORV license in the past, thank you. If you're new to off-roading, we hope you enjoy the ride!
