#### From Under the Presidents Helmet

If you are like me, you cannot wait to dust off your ATV for the new 2015 riding season and get out on the trails. As you are checking over your ride to make sure that it is as ready as you are for a summer of trail riding, MI-TRALE is setting up our spring safety checkup of your trails. Every spring is a challenge for us to get out and inspect your miles of trails to clear brush, repair trail damage and schedule minor and major repairs in time for your first ride. We never know what the winter will leave behind for us to work on. There is always a surprise or two. We do ask that you do your part by noting any trail concerns and if it is not something that you can take care of (i.e. move a rock hazard or small branch), make sure you contact your MI-TRALE trail Boss and report the concern. If it is a safety issue, please find a way to mark a warning on the trail to alert your fellow riders. Let's work together to keep our trails safe for each other.

#### **Major Announcements:**

MI-TRALE has just been selected by Polaris Industries to receive a \$10,000 grant to purchase trail maintenance equipment to help us provide safe trails for you. Additional details will be announced as purchases are made. When you visit a Polaris dealer, make sure you say thank you!

MI-TRALE also was just selected by the Lac Vieux Desert Band of Lake Superior Chippewa Indians to receive \$5,000 to be used for additional ORV signage on your trails. These signs will be installed in the villages that we share to help guide you to local services and points of interest.

Your board has been very busy this winter in planning for the 2015 riding season. Some projects I am sure you will enjoy are:

- Opening a new trail that will connect Land O' Lakes, Wisconsin to the Bond Falls State Park. This is made possible by working with the Ottawa National Forest to open up several key roads for ATV use. The opening is scheduled for July 01, 2015. We are looking for volunteers to help brush and sign this new trail. If you have an interest and would like to support your trails, please contact the MI-TRALE Trail Boss. We are in the process of planning a grand opening for August 22, 2015. Mark this date down.
- 2. The 4<sup>th</sup> Annual SPORT Ride is scheduled for June 13, 2015. You may recall that this event started when we opened a new trail (DH) between Baraga and Twin Lakes States Parks. For this year we are planning a very special ride. We will still have an option to ride between the two State Parks, but also have the opportunity to ride from the Twin Lakes State Park to the Ontonagon Township Park located on Lake Superior! This is the only legal ATV access location on the west shore of Lake Superior. But to make this ride even better, we are going to ride the proposed new multi-use trail

between Ontonagon, and Rockland (OR Trail). We are just getting into the planning details for this year's event. Would like to hear if you have an interest in joining the fun. We will be sending out updates and how to sign up in the next few months. Early registration: call either (906) 288-3321 ask for Rich, or (906) 353-6558 ask for Kelly.

- 3. We have talked about placing geocache locations on your trails to add another bit of fun to your rides. We will be finally doing this on the Pioneer ATV and the Courtney Equestrian Trails this spring as a pilot. If we receive positive feedback from you and if it does not become a maintenance nightmare, we will expand this to your other trail systems in the future. Your feedback is important to us to be able to determine if this will be something that you will use, so please take the time and let us know your thoughts and ideas. If you are a "cacher" already, we will be placing the locations on GeoCache.com for your convenience.
- 4. The Pioneer trail has provided you with some real challenges the past few years. There will be an engineering inspection of the entire trail completed this spring to prepare a remediation package that will provide us with the engineering recommendations and specifications to request construction bids to repair the trail. We had hoped that this would have been done in 2014, but the late and very wet spring forced us to wait for this year. I thank you for your patience in getting this done. As you may know we did get the multiple holes repaired at the Bergland section last summer, but the challenging holes at the Victoria end are still there and will be more than most of you care to try. There is a signed by-pass using the Victoria Cutoff trail in place.
- 5. Your Multi-Use Western UP Trails Guide is now in the Houghton and Ironwood Walmart stores! This is really great news for us. It just shows how great this new trails guide is to everyone that has seen it. If you do not have your copy yet, just go to <a href="https://www.mi-trale.org">www.mi-trale.org</a> and select the ATV/ORV, then maps in the drop down box. The rest is easy as we now use PayPal to help you out.

#### Help Keep Your Trails Open

As you prepare your ride plans for the 2015 season, please keep in mind to ride this season in a safe manner and stay on the marked trails. I cannot stress enough that a sure way to lose our access to trails is by going off of them. Resource damage caused by going off trail is our number one reason why we are not able to get or lose permits from private property owners, so please ride responsibly and encourage others to do the same. When we ride our trails we are all our own ambassadors. By working and riding together we will be able to maintain and expand our trail system.



# Courtney Equestrian Trails News

#### Cathy Wainio EQ Director Reports:

#### March 2015 - EQUESTRIAN PROJECT REPORT

Some good information was gained during our February 24th meeting with several key people from the Ontonagon Ranger station / Ottawa National Forest. Here is some insight on our Equestrian projects.

#### RAC COURTNEY EQ TRAILS - PHASE I:

This is the "Water Hole" \$5,000.00 grant of which there is still \$840 left to spend. It was the consensus that it would be spent on trail heads. Unexpected delays occurred which prevents us from spending it before the May 2015 deadline. The ONF has approved an extension of this grant fund through May of 2018.

This project was tied in with a logging project and resulted, unexpectedly so, in a closed gate blocking off a part of our EQ trail on Forest Road 1841. I was told by FS some time ago, that it was intended to block motorized traffic during the logging project and that we can propose to change it in the future...perhaps with a specialized style that will allow non-motorized traffic to pass.

There is still the possibility of needing to level parts of the trail and haul in some sand or fine gravel to complete the "water hole" project.

NOTE: An additional \$2,000.00 in RAC funds was offered to MI-TRALE's Courtney EQ Trails. I am not sure where this will be spent...possibly on a trail heads.

#### RAC COURTNEY EQ TRAILS - PHASE II:

The amount of \$9,500.00 is mainly for river bank remediation's to repair ATV use damage. An illegal plank crossing will be removed and ATV traffic re-directed. This ties in with the PORI project.

#### PORI JUNCTION VEGETATION MANAGEMENT PROJECT:

This is a project strictly managed by the Ottawa National Forest, which involves logging, road use decisions, stream and river repairs and recreational enhancements, to name a few things.

Engineering Evaluations are scheduled for this year. A "hard surface" river crossing is expected to be in place during F/Y 2016. A shared trail head (for horses and cross-country skiers) is also a part of the final outcome of this project.

#### STEP Grant:

We have fund remaining for trail repairs and a culvert and signage. We wait advice from the Forest Service as to when those repairs can be done. The PORI project may play into this also. Janet Miesbauer is working with ONF Environmental Specialists, on Invasive Species signs. We have other signs to consider: shared trail head, shared trail etiquette, and MDOT signage on the highway. Regarding youth involvement at work bees: we felt there was interest. News articles brought no response. We still have a couple leads on interested groups, and will possible pursue them in the spring. This will not cost us anything, but will lend to our in-kind work.

For all ONF projects considered, our Partners from the Ottawa National Forest plan to hit the ground with MI-TRALE in the spring, to see first-hand how these projects and funds could complement each other.

#### SIMAR CAMP GROUND - DNR FUNDED:

I expect that design on this project will happen soon. Not sure when MI-TRALE's involvement will begin. This is a big deal...and I expect they have evaluated it and come to understand of exactly what they want. Their experts will be busy. I suggest when they are ready; MI-TRALE will meet with them and get advice as to what agreements or working relationship MI-TRALE will have with the DNR on this project.
